Pamplin Historical Park's "The Civil War in the Trans-Mississippi" Tour Explore the Civil War in the Trans-Mississippi

Petersburg, VA – Pamplin Historical Park and The National Museum of the Civil War Soldier invites history enthusiasts to its Third Annual Members' Tour on September 22-30, 2008. The theme for the 2008 tour is "The Civil War in the Trans-Mississippi." This week-long adventure begins and ends in Kansas City, Missouri.

Participants will join A. Wilson Greene, President of Pamplin Historical Park, and local historians and guides on a tour spanning four states, including Kansas, Missouri, Arkansas, and Oklahoma. Among the fourteen battlefields, museums, and historic homes on the itinerary are Wilson's Creek, Pea Ridge, Prairie Grove and Fort Scott. The tour features behind-the-scenes visits to the Kansas History Museum, "historical dramas", and even guest musical performances. Overnight accommodations in Kansas City, Joplin, Mo., and Rogers, Arkansas compliment meals in the area's best restaurants (think steaks, barbeque and homemade pies!). Transportation in a full-sized luxury motor coach makes the journey a breeze.
